### **English**

July was an exciting month for our Early Years learners as they dived into the world of English through Jolly Phonics, rhymes, and stories. 


### **Mathematics**

July was full of hands-on fun as our little learners explored numbers and shapes with great enthusiasm! They practiced counting from 1 to 10 through rhymes, games, and finger play, and counted real-life objects up to 5 to build a strong number sense. Children joyfully traced numbers 2 and 3 using worksheets, sand trays, and air writing to develop fine motor skills. They also explored shapes, focusing on squares and rectangles through observation, comparison, and a fun classroom "Shape Hunt." A creative highlight was making rectangles with ice cream sticks!













### **Understanding the World**

In July, our little explorers dived into the world of animals and families through fun, interactive learning. They learned the names and sounds of animals like cows, lions, and elephants using flashcards, rhymes, and videos. Children also explored types of animals—farm, wild, and pets—and began classifying them. We introduced the concept of life stages (infant, adult, and old) and basic family members such as mother, father, and grandparents. Through songs, stories, and discussions, children connected with the world around them in meaningful and joyful ways!









# Discovering Music: A Magical Journey of Sound and Joy!

Our EY-1 learners have been joyfully exploring music through rhythm, rhyme, movement, and imagination. They listened to favorites like Wheels on the Bus, Five Little Ducks, and Hickory Dickory Dock, sparking curiosity and rhythm recognition. Hickory Dickory Dock was a highlight as children acted it out, learning sequencing and storytelling. Through beats, claps, and instrumental cues, they practiced listening, pattern recognition, and following directions—building strong auditory skills through joyful play.







### Physical Education (PE)

Our little adventurers had a fantastic time moving, playing, and growing strong all through their exciting playground adventures! Activities like swinging, climbing, sliding, and crawling kept them moving and smiling, all while strengthening their big muscles. They pumped their legs on swings, climbed like little adventurers, and slid down with joy, boosting balance, coordination, and control. Crawling through tunnels added to the excitement and helped them plan their moves. These playful moments also supported their sense of balance and motion most joyfully!
