### **English**

This month, our young learners had a wonderful time exploring tricky words and practicing Jolly Phonics Group 4 to 7 sounds. They blended sounds to form 4-5 letter words and framed simple sentences using flashcards. Activities like "Read and Build a Sentence" made learning interactive. A special highlight was the poem "Bubbles", where children sang and blew bubbles, making word learning joyful. Matching tricky words while listening to the poem reinforced word recognition through play. These hands-on activities helped children strengthen reading, blending, and sentence-building skills in a fun way.









#### **Mathematics**

In July, our young learners explored exciting math concepts like Estimation, Number Names (0-10), subitizing up to 10, Days of the Week, Describing Length, Mass, Capacity, and Backward Counting (10 to 1). Activities like a Treasure Hunt, where children arranged numbers in backward order, and a Round Robin with digital games, clay modeling, and writing tasks made learning fun and hands-on. These engaging activities helped children visualize numbers, practice their skills, and understand math in a playful and meaningful way.













## **Understanding the World**

In July, our young learners began an exciting unit on Farms and Being Outside. They went on a nature walk, observing and sorting living and non-living things using "I See, I Think, I Wonder." Children explored seeds, noticing their size, colour, and shape. The children loved exploring planting activities—first watching seeds sprout in water, then moving them onto cotton, and finally planting them in soil to watch them grow. The highlight of their learning was a fun field trip to a farm, where they discovered which fruits and vegetables grow above the soil and which grow below. This hands-on experience deepened their understanding of plant growth in a memorable and exciting way!







## **Primary Computing**

In our computing lesson, learners began with a quick revision of computer systems, recalling the input and output devices, and hardware and software. They also learned how to properly switch off a computer system. After the recap, they moved on to understanding the structure of spreadsheets by learning what rows and columns are and how to identify and use rows and columns correctly. These foundational skills helped them better organize and manage information using digital tools.







### **Global Perspectives**

This month, EY3 explored "All About Me and Others." Through mirror play, self-portraits, and group games like "Who Am I?," children learned how everyone is unique. Activities like "My Likes and Yours" encouraged comparison and appreciation of differences. Students began using sentence starters like "I like..." and "My friend likes..." to reflect on personal identity.





# Musical Explorers: Rhythm, Culture & Connection!

In July, our young musicians joyfully explored the world of sound, rhythm, and culture. They were introduced to traditional Indian instruments like the sitar and tabla, enjoying their soothing melodies and lively beats. Through storytelling, music appreciation, and movement, children discovered how music can express emotions, tell stories, and reflect culture and identity. These experiences not only enhanced their listening and concentration skills but also encouraged creativity and self-expression. By engaging with different sounds and rhythms, children began to build a deeper connection with music, making their learning both meaningful and memorable in a playful, engaging environment.





## Physical Education (PE)

In July, EY3 was buzzing with fun and learning through play and games! Children developed gross motor skills by running, jumping, and navigating obstacle courses, while their thinking skills grew through memory, matching, and sorting activities. Social skills flourished as they took turns, played in teams, and followed rules during team races and ball games. Building challenges with Lego and wooden blocks sparked creativity and problem-solving, helping children build confidence, focus, and collaboration—all while having a great time!





# Visual Arts: EY III Artists Mastering Design & Color!

Our EY III art class has been buzzing with creativity! We delved into the fascinating worlds of symmetrical and radial designs, creating balanced and beautiful patterns. Little hands and fingers got wonderfully messy with hand and finger painting, exploring expressive art. Most excitingly, we embarked on a color theory adventure, transforming primary colors into vibrant secondary hues! It's incredible to see their understanding of art concepts blossom.
