and excitement, while also enhancing fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and
promoting focus and independence in our little learners.











Mathematics

In July, our Pre-Nursery children explored basic concepts through fun and engaging activities. They learned about 2D shapes, such as circles and triangles, using sand writing, air writing, flashcards, and interactive screens. Oral counting from 1 to 5 was practiced with real objects, helping build number sense. They also discovered the concept of big and small through hands-on experiences. These activities supported the development of shape recognition, comparative thinking, and fine and gross motor skills in an enjoyable, playful environment.

July was a fun and engaging month for our Pre-Nursery children as they explored the names of animals, fruits, and colours. Using colourful flashcards, they learned to recognize and name different animals, fruits, and colours.
